

At the Canadian Nurses Foundation our core mission is to provide scholarships, bursaries and certification awards to nursing students and nurse researchers across Canada at the baccalaureate, masters and Pd.D. levels. CNF's Awards vary in amount from \$750 to \$20,000 thanks to our donors who invest in them.

CNF is Expanding Its Reach to Include Bursaries

While Scholarships have been the primary focus of CNF, and are typically based on merit, we recognize there are many reasons nursing students struggle to succeed in school, one the most prevalent being financial challenges. To address this, in 2022 CNF and CeraVe partnered to establish the **CeraVe Skincare Scholarships for Diversity and Equity Program**. This new program awarded 12 bursaries to nursing students to help with financial assistance ultimately encouraging retention and continuance as a nursing student.

TYLENOL® Fund to Advance Diversity in Nursing and Health Equity Research for Black, Indigenous or People of Colour

Tamasha's story is one of hope, passion and perseverance. At just 6-years old, Tamasha's family escaped the violence of war-torn Democratic Republic of the Congo and found sanctuary in a refugee camp in Malawi. Tamasha grew up in the camp and became interested in healthcare/nursing when she started volunteering with health authorities at 16. Tamasha earned a scholarship to come to Canada in 2018 from the World University Services Canada (WUSC) who provides scholarships to young refugees in camps around the world. It also provided her with permanent resident status in Canada.

Since then, Tamasha has become a full-time student who also works full time to support herself and her family in Malawi. She is the President of the Student Nursing Undergraduate Society at UBC. She sees herself working in rural health in the future where inequities in health care are so deeply felt. Thanks to TYLNEOL'S innovative new scholarship support, Tamasha will receive committed funding to help with her education for two years, not just one.

The 'Working Mind Healthcare' is a partnership between the *Canadian Nurses Foundation* and *Mental Health Commission of Canada* to provide mental health training to nurses and nurse leaders across Canada and has been **accredited by Canadian Nurses Association** for continuing education credit.

The program has been developed to initiate a shift in the way nurses and nursing leaders think, act, and feel about mental health in the workplace. It is specifically designed for employees and managers in the healthcare sector and long-term care setting. TWN Healthcare introduces participants to the concepts of mental health and stigma, and it discusses impacts of stigma on individuals living with mental health problems. It also will help participants recognize and keep track of changes in
